# **Children's Film Festivals: Their Mission & Meaning**

In the past years, the festivals for children have developed in a relatively confused manner, partially due to the lack of references, rules and orchestration. The differences in the diverse approaches, with some excesses of drifting, risk further compromising the already limited space available for the distribution of quality films and the lively cultural milieu of children's cinema.

which people change their daily routine for something out of the ordinary. At a festival one talks, discusses, appreciates and criticises and above all, one communicates and exchanges.

When exploring a sector such as that of the children's cinema, it is necessary to choose an artistic approach which is well-defined and culturally convincing. This allows the purely filmrelated discussion to be extended to involve parents, teachers, educators, and the general public as well, and not iust those associated with the industry, to consider and examine,

along with the children, the themes concerning the young and their relationship to the sphere of communication through images.

Festivals in general, and even more those for c hildren, should contribute to the development of an open



awareness to the world's problems, teaching a sense of responsibility and active personal participation, respect, attention to values, capacity for dialogue, as well as making a conscious

stand on the rights of children. As prescribed by the "Convention of the Rights for Children", ratified by the UN in 1989: "The child has a right to peace and recreation, the right to devote itself to play, and to participate in cultural and artistic activities."

Films for children and festivals for children are a part of such cultural and artistic acti-

vities. They are an integral part of cultural education in the sense of the democratic fundamental "culture for all". Cultural education plays an important role in the

everyday life of children. Playing, contact with different media, and the acquisition of media content, are meaningful activities in present-day childhood.

"The cultural competence of children refers above all to media, its availability and content." (Juergen Barthelmes: Thesen zum Kinderkino).

Similarily, children's festivals, while not neglecting entertainment and spectacle, should present works with an artistic, sociological, historical and inherent viewpoint. In addition to presenting recently produced and distributed films (previews of "majors"), festivals should endeavour to include unknown film makers and limited distributed films. The mission of a festival is to arouse and stimulate the curiosity of the general public and to endeavour to promote their knowledge and education.

Confronting, via a cinematographic work, some of the problems which interest young people the most, can provide an opportunity for dialogue, a source of awareness of the reality which surrounds them. The cinema should be an occasion to meet and to exchange. Each film therefore ends up becoming, sometimes despite the author, often despite the audience who willingly flock to the festival, an inevitable opportunity for communication and dialogue.

But, in the actual world, it sometimes becomes difficult to define the "cinema for children"! It even becomes difficult to define "children", or "adolescents"! Children and adolescents appear in the eyes of the cultural industry, the information systems and the consumer promotion mechanisms, as objects that must be controlled even thought this is denied.

"Childhood, as a cultural product, rather than as a fact of nature, is therefore disappearing, but it has never been stronger as an economical object".

For all these reasons, the organisers of festivals are invited to the Poznan Conference in order to reflect together and to seek the means for a better co-ordination (schedules, programmes, marketing, financing, audiences, relationships to other professionals and new media), but also to favour a certain "moral" for their approaches. This does not mean the joining together of the conditions and the objectives, but the presentation, in their multiplicity, of the whole range of the festivals targeted at children, attempting to create simultaneously a network of communications and new possibilities, of co-ordination and co-operation of the activities, and above all, a redefinition of the roles within the actual audio-visual world.

KFK is an independent festival of films made by and for children and a meeting place for young filmmakers, media experts and the interested public. The preselection jury had a hard job to choose 45 productions out of more than 300 entries. The members of this year's pre-selection jury were Amir Esfandiari (Iran), Pjotr Zalewski (Poland), Jo-Anne Blouin (Canada), Eli Stangeland (Norway), Felix Vanginderhuysen and Gert Hermans (both Belgium). # **CIFEJ Celebrates 50th Anniversary**

Kanoon, the Institute for Intellectual Development of Children and Young Adults at Teheran/Islamic Republic of Iran will host CIFEJ's 50th anniversary celebrations from May 25th to June 1st 2005. CIFEJ is the French acronym for Centre International du Film pour l'enfance et la Jeunesse, i.e. the International Centre of Film for Children and Young People.

Representatives of national children's film centres from all over the world, and - with the more open attitude of CIFEJ in recent years - also children's film experts from nongovernmental organisations and companies will meet at Teheran to celebrate this remarkable anniversary, to look back at the roots of children's film culture, but also to discuss the present day situation and future developments.

The look back at CIFEJ's history for example will consist of a book published by the organisation's ex-general secretary Robert Roy, and a film directed by Miomir Rajcevic on CIFEJ's oldest member Kati Ranódy, who founded the Hungarian Film Centre for Children and Youth. Topics more concerned with present and future times are children's film and media culture in Latin America and the Asian-Pacific region or gender representation in children's film. The presentation of the 5th World Summit on Media for Children, which will be held under the theme "Media as a Tool for Global Peace and Democracy" in South Africa in March 2007 and meetings with representatives from the highly reputed Iranian film culture for children will complete the celebrations.

For several years now there has been an excellent co-operation between CIFEJ and ECFA with the Kids For Kids Festival as the most visuable common project. Also the personal links are important with CIFEJ's ex-president Jerzy Moszkovicz on ECFA's board as well as Florence Dupont who is an active board member in both organisations.

The six winners will be invited to the 6th Film Festival 'du grain à démoudre', from October 7th to 15th 2005 (the organizers will take care of transportation/accomodation and activities costs).

During the festival they will make up the script writing jury, which will be presided over by the competition winner in 2004. They will award the prize for best screenplay within the framework of the official selection of films. This will happen during the closing ceremony of the festival taking place on October 15th 2005.
